As many of you are now aware, Mr Bruce Mesley retired as Principal of Dromana Primary School last Friday, effective immediately. Due to an ongoing health concern and its ongoing management Bruce was advised to step down from his role. It is with mixed emotion that I am now in the seat once filled by Bruce as the Acting Principal until the end of term one 2020.

I am excited to continue in the footsteps of Bruce, but saddened by his sudden departure and the gap he will leave in the community that is Dromana Primary School. Bruce leaves Dromana Primary School a much better place than he found it, with many programs, facilities and structures being credited to his leadership. Bruce was instrumental in the set up of the Science and Aboriginal Studies program, Coding and Robotics program and the Marine Education Centre (Boat Shed), Indigenous Garden and recent Prep outdoor area re-design.

Bruce was truly a community Principal, always looking out for and supporting the students, parents, staff and the local community of Dromana. There are many thousands of students and staff who have been positively impacted by Bruce over his 38 years in education, and 6 years as Principal of Dromana Primary School.

We wish Bruce all the very best as he begins retirement.

Dogs in school

If you have a child in prep, you may see Rollo the Leonberger puppy visiting throughout this term. Rollo is a therapy dog in training who is become accustomed to life in school.

As a school, we support the addition of therapy dogs in classrooms, working alongside our students, with careful consideration taken for those students who may be anxious around dogs or suffer allergies to dogs.

There is strong evidence to suggest that these highly trained animals can:

- Assist in teaching empathy and appropriate interpersonal skills
- Assist help individuals develop social skills
- May be soothing for students exhibited signs of stress and anxiety

As well as Rollo, we also continue will continue to see Milo the 'Story Dog' with his handler Andrea at our school on a weekly basis supporting specific children with their reading confidence. The premise behind the 'Story Dog' program is that when children read to dogs there is no judgement, and reading confidence is boosted. The students who read to Milo seem to thoroughly enjoy his visits.

Please note that Therapy and Assistance dogs are permitted with proof of training and with consideration of our school population, however it is the best interest of our whole community that pet dogs stay outside of our school grounds during the busiest times of day. We ask that families please leave their pet dogs at home during school hours (8.30 – 4.00) or safely keep them outside school grounds when attending our school or school events.

Curriculum & Learning Across the School

Changes Over Time (Foundation Unit of Study - Term 4)

A terrific end to the Toys over Time section of this unit was celebrated with family members coming in to share some of the toys from their generation. There was much fun as well as learning happening as students played games from the past with family members. A big thank you to all families that were able to attend or even contribute to some of the displays for the afternoon.

From Farm to Plate (Grade 1A, 1B, 1C & 1/2D Unit of Study - Term 4)

All Grades have already visited Heronswood Garden on a 'Kitchen Garden' tour as part of their Farm to Plate unit this term. All grades jumped on board 'Norm' the bus to learn a bit about the plant life cycle and what foods could be grown locally.

I Can Be Happy, Healthy and Safe (Grade 2 Unit of Study - Term 4)

The focus for 2A, 2B and 2C this week and last week has been examining what makes us safe out in the community. Some of these areas within focus have included crossing the road and visiting the beach.

Strengthening through Success, Challenge and Failure - (Grade 3 Unit of Study - Term 4)

Social, physical and mental challenges have all assisted in helping the Grade 3 students to recognise and acknowledge the various emotions that we feel during different activities and situations. Defining ideas around success and failure have allowed students to recognise that you may not be successful in an activity (like being the winner) however there is an ability to have personal success.

Design Technologies - Reduce Single Use (Grade 4 Unit of Study - Term 4)

The Grade 4 students have had some tremendous feedback regarding their manners and behaviour after their visit this week to Legoland (as part of their Design Technologies unit). On top of learning some of the design methods when in Legoland, students also used the opportunity to rate the many stores within Chadstone in terms of their overall sustainability in terms of the products they were selling. The Grade 4 students also had a visit from Miss Higgins who is a champion of reducing waste to the point that she only needs to put her bin out once every few months!

Where are our 'happy' places in Dromana? (Grade 5 Unit of Study - Term 4)

Finding happy places can be at times kind of subjective, however the grade 5 students are discovering that we can use the power of maths to assist in providing a general scale to inform others around our community of what might qualify as a 'Happy Place'.

Over the past 2 weeks students have defined and experienced positive and negative stressors such as physical, social, intellectual, emotional as well as environmental stressors.

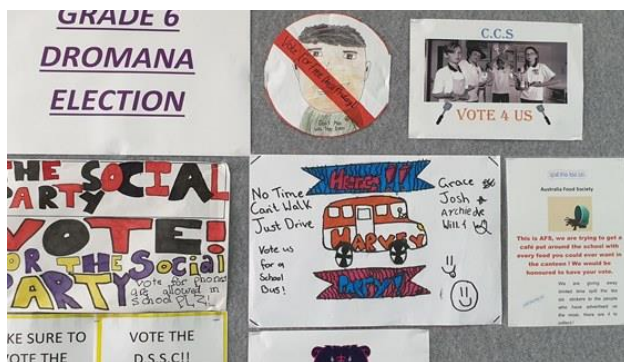

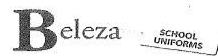

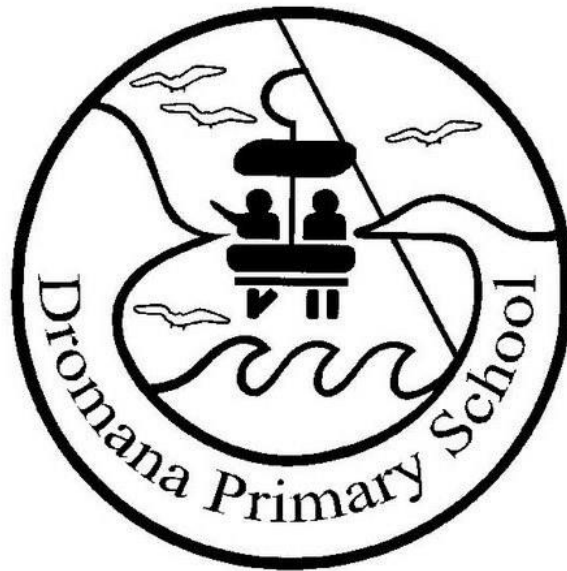
